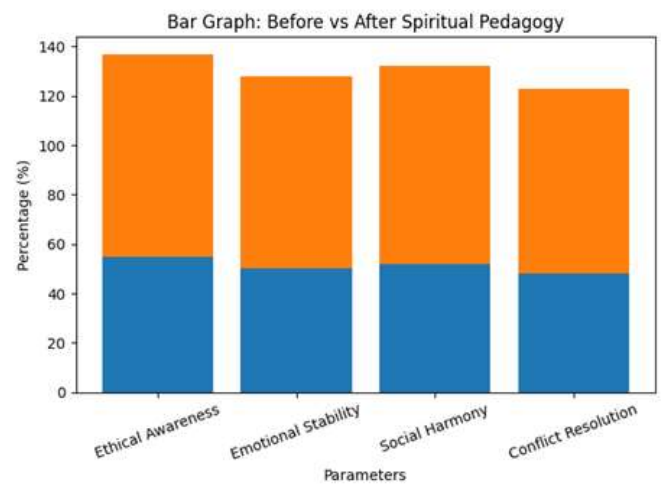

Table 1: Impact of Spiritual Pedagogy on Peace Education Indicators

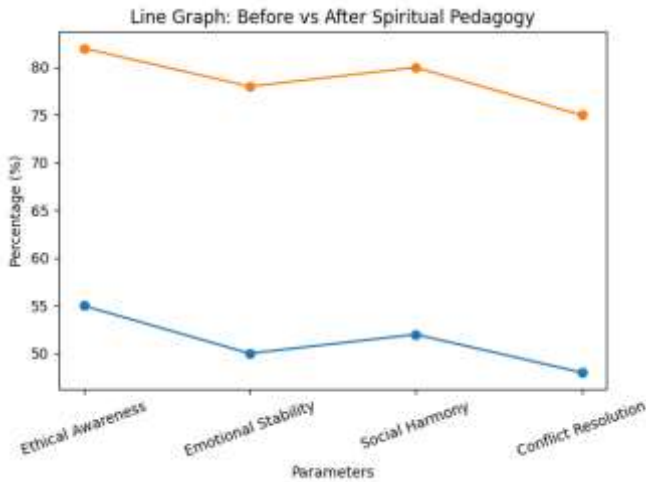
